- Planned Baptisms for the coming days and weeks are to be deferred until a suitable date can be arranged later.
- The Sacrament of Reconciliation will not take place during this time of restriction.
- Funerals may be celebrated with 25 mourners present
- Weddings may be celebrated with up to 25 guests.
- Parish Office open from Monday -Friday, 11.30 a.m. 5.00 p.m. Closed for lunch 1.30 p.m. – 2.30 p.m.

Once again, we are being called upon to act in a way that is supportive of our communities and of those who are in need. We are particularly mindful of the bereaved at this time, as we truly acknowledge how difficult these restrictions are. Please know that we carry you in our thoughts and prayers.

We are truly grateful to the sacristans, the stewards, the Eucharistic and Liturgical ministers, the cantors, and all involved in having maintained the smooth running and maintenance of the churches when reopened. The co-operation of all the public coming through the doors ensured a safe environment for all, whilst also ensuring a sacred and reflective space.
