- **The Cathedral and Bóthar na Naomh Church will remain open for private prayer. The Cathedral will open between 11.30 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. Bóthar na Naomh Church will open from 9.00 am – 2.00 p.m.**
 - **Masses will be celebrated daily (Monday – Sunday) in the Cathedral at 11.00 a.m. & 7.00 p.m. Mass will be celebrated in Bóthar na Naomh Church at 9.00 a.m. every Sunday. All Masses are live streamed from our parish website. Masses can be heard through the local Cathedral & Bóthar na Naomh Radio links.**
 - **Planned Baptisms are deferred until a suitable date can be arranged later.**
 - **The Sacrament of Reconciliation will not take place during this time of restriction.**
 - **Funeral Masses may be celebrated with 25 mourners present.**
 - **Weddings may be celebrated with up to 25 guests.**
 - **Parish Office open from Monday -Friday, 11.30 a.m. – 5.00 p.m. Closed for lunch 1.30 p.m. – 2.30 p.m.**
 - **Visits to Cemeteries are allowed under Level 5 Covid-19 restrictions.**
