- Travel: We must stay within a radius of 5km unless we need to leave for essential purposes which include:
 1. To attend a wedding or a funeral;
 - 2. To visit a grave.
- <u>Wearing of face coverings is expected when visiting the Cathedral or</u> <u>Bóthar na Naomh Church</u>. (It is understood that for medical reasons some people may not be able to comply with this request.)
